**CALL TO ORDER:**

The public hearing was called to order Monday, January 5, 2004 at 6:45, by President of Council Jon Snyder.

Mr. Snyder: It's in regard to the proposed amendment to Chapter 1151 Signs and Ordinances No. 50-03. Mrs. Herr, will you please call the roll?
