7. Recognition of Visitors

Mr. Snyder: Is there anybody in the audience wishing to speak to the Council this evening? Mr. Mayor you have a guest?

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Mr. Rice: Yes. Thank you Mr. President. As we discussed here at Council about three weeks ago, the City has retained the J Group to head up our economic development activity. At that time I also told Council that we'd have the J Group here to make a presentation. At least an initial presentation of what's going to be happening through this professional service contract. Scheduled for last week, obviously got pushed back to this week. And we do have two members of the J Group and I'd like to recognize Dave Johnson, who is the head of the group, for a brief presentation to Council and opportunity for Council to ask them any questions you may want to ask them at this point in time. Understanding we're just getting started. And - but I think we've made a lot of progress just in the last -- first couple weeks. So Dave...

Dave Johnson: Thank you Mayor, Mr. President of Council and distinguished council members and former council members, Ted Scheffler and my old colleague. I'm really excited about the opportunity to talk a little about the economic development opportunities in this wonderful City of North Canton. Matter of fact I said I feel like the mosquito that flew up on the edge of the fence at the nudist colony and looked down and said the potential's so great I don't know where to start. And there's a lot of potential in this town. And that -- when I thought about what I would say to the Council and the Administration and John Boyajian, nice to see you John -- John's always been a good friend and very active and we appreciate working with him too; and, when I thought about it, I thought, you know, having sat here in 1960's, late 60's, on this Council and then served as mayor before I went in the legislature, I couldn't help but think every time I talked about North Canton, what a blessing we have to live in this wonderful area. And when you think about the fact that we're blessed with good transportation, good community activities and community participation, we do have good utilities here and we've always had a reputation of being a first class city and giving our constituents the service they need. And with our easy access to Route 77 and with the space available, even though it's available on a somewhat limited basis on some of the outskirts in certain directions, there's still a lot of potential here. And notwithstanding all these great things and the great leadership that we've seen in the past. And we have seen some wonderful people step forward in this city and dedicate their time and efforts and expertise to help us. I can't help but think there's a lot of work to be done. There's a lot we could be doing and a lot we should be doing. And with that in mind, after working more than 30 years in government at various positions, and incidently having been a member of the Chamber of Commerce here and having my own business for 25 years, in addition to serving in the legislature I, after retiring from that particular area, I formed a group called the J Group - The Johnson Group. And with that in mind, my wife Marge, after working for over 20 years in this area, in city government, has joined me as well as my daughter Teri. Teri comes to us with 20 years of experience, having worked in areas with business and commercial endeavors, as well as large community foundations. And worked in Massillon for a good many years with all of the officials there. And I think she has some idea of what it takes to get things rolling after that experience. So with that in mind Mr. Mayor, Mr. President and members of Council, we thought we'd just give you a brief overlay of some of the things we have done. Teri is going to bring you up to date about some of the meetings that we've had in the last two weeks and some of the meetings we have pending. And then we're going to give you just a list of maybe 10 or 12 things without getting into detail about what we think should be at least examined before we press on. So with that Teri will come up now and talk to you a little about what we've done.

Teri Johnson: Thank you. Well he's always been a tough act to follow and needless to say he still is. I'm glad to see a fellow colleague here from the Massillon area. The last 10 years I have been in the Massillon greater Western Stark County area doing some development work, foundation work and so I'm looking forward to being able to work with Jim and welcome that opportunity, as well as with all of you. As I mentioned, he's a hard act to follow. He's also a hard person to stick up with there and stay up with, even though he's not really as young as he used to be when his picture is over there - that hair color changed a little. But regardless he does a lot of work in a very quick period of time. And I think the meetings that we've already had with Tom have proven that. Probably just since we first got the go ahead, besides meeting with Tom, we've been able to also have some wonderful meetings with the Chamber as well as the -- certainly Daryl, with the Regional Director of Development, our Stark County Development regional position with Steve Paquette, also with looking with bringing Sam Speck in, talking with them, as well as Bruce Johnson and several others. Again, when we get into some of these ten different areas we've already probably talked to at least the lead person in every area that we are hoping to embrace. So with that we will probably get into quickly ten issues that we'd like to address up front and see where we can go from there. Thank you.

Mr. Johnson: Wait, stay up there.

Ms. Johnson: Yea, I was going to say we're going to tag team here so...

Mr. Johnson: The first area -- incidently Bruce Johnson, Teri mentioned, is the new director of development for the State of Ohio. A former state senator, Bruce Johnson is -- comes with a vast experience. He was the author of the deregulation bill for electric and served on various committees. He has a degree in economics. And he'll be coming to this area in the -- probably this month and we're scheduled to meet with him and the Mayor and some others. And we'll talk about that when we get

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things finalized, but we've already made two contacts. In addition to that, Sam Speck, Teri mentioned, is coming on the 27th of October. Sam is the director of Ohio Department of Natural Resources. And of course that means some reclamation, open spaces and other grants that are available from the State of Ohio. In various areas we will be talking to him and hopefully we can make some progress. The first thing we talked about, when we talked with the Mayor and with other members and the Chamber of Commerce is the water situation in North Canton. And certainly we need to do all we can to make sure that we continue to work with the -- with everyone here including the Water Superintendent, Rich - I met with Rich as well. And it seems to me that there may be some help available someplace in the State of Ohio to write to get us some revenue. We're going to check and see what's available. I've checked with the Public Works Department, State of Ohio and the Ohio Water Development Authority and I have information that's going to be sent to us in those areas. So that hopefully we can talk about some of the things like the reauthorization of the Safe Drinking Water Act that was introduced and implemented by the Congress. And in that particular fund there was a large amount of money that was in a "rotary fund" and it's a water rotary fund, every state has access to it. And we're going to be checking those things out. It's about time we started finding out what's available in North Canton. So those are just a few things we're going to talk about with the water. Now we're certainly interested in any suggestions from anyone that -- you might direct them to the Mayor, we certainly want to hear from everyone.

Ms. Johnson: Land audit - we know for a fact that it's very essential that we know each and every lot that's available for not only the existing businesses, for expansion purposes, but also certainly for trying to attract new business. It's very vital, as all of you can imagine, if someone is interested in coming to North Canton, which we're going to try to get much more interest in that, that the first question they have is so where can we go. And we felt it'd be really key and important again working with Jim and his staff to really be able to have that very accessible for us to be able to say here's the properties and land available and whether water, sewer, etc., connections are already there and where we stand on that.

Mr. Johnson: We're also very interested in traffic counts and availability access coming in; ingress, regress for various properties. And I'm sure that once we get that when people come to town and say I might be interested in a business, what's available? We can say well there's six spots that might meet your requirements here they are; we'll look at them, we'll work with you so on. Recycling projects with them, with the Director of the Department of Natural Resources coming to town, we certainly want to talk a little about some of the recycling projects. I think you have one that the Mayor has talked about or instituted that's coming on line. And there may be and there should be some help available in certain areas for people that are taking and making the effort to reach out and take care of programs like this. We will be checking with the various departments on not only recycling, but open space availability and some help for green space, open space, park spaces. We hope to have a list of suggestions that we could run over and discuss with the Department of Natural Resources.

Ms. Johnson: Post office - and with that everyone smiles and nods their head. Kind of the obvious, first and foremost. Possibly a little too small, unsafe with the traffic, etc., etc., everybody's complaints continue on. I think we certainly know we need to look into that. I'll have some Chamber and TAP groups working it. At the present want to be able to facilitate all the people so that we're all on the same page saying the same thing. In the interim already dad has had a key contact on a regional basis in Akron and has since been sent the forms and papers that we need to fill out to further this investigation of how to improve our post office.

Mr. Johnson: I've talked to the administrative manager of the post office for this region and he sent me, as Teri has already indicated, a document. This is a very complex and very tedious adventure to try to get involved with this administration -- administrative mirage - it's very complex. And I know that you have to be on a list and I know there are various agencies that have to make recommendations and not the least of which is land and so on and availability. And we're going to work on that and we're going to visit them personally. I happen to also know that the Congress has a post office committee and it's about time we checked with people in the Congress that are dealing with this as well. The other thing we want to talk to people about and do some checking on is expanded parking in the near city here, downtown area if you will. At times people talk about parking and what's available, what you could do, what you couldn't do. And we want to do more work in that area and give the information to the administration.

Ms. Johnson: Open space - Dad did already mention it. So without belaboring it too much more, again Sam Speck coming to town on August 27th. One of our biggest issues too with him is to see about us qualifying for the open space and different things that we need with green space, etc. And again working with Steve Paquette as well as others about disbursing money and seeing how we can get into that sort of thing and reclaim some brown fields, etc.

Mr. Johnson: The next three items are rather complex, but we're gathering information on them now. And hopefully as soon as I get them information and I'm able to digest it and talk to the Law Director, Assistant Law Director and so on about it, we'll try to make some recommendations. But a JEDD, forming a JEDD - a Joint Economic Development District, is something that possibly could be looked at.

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especially when you're dealing with townships that are contiguous to us. And with the -- I guess the challenges of communicating and cooperating not only as a city, as a political subdivision here, but dealing with the townships that are near us. I have information I've received from State Representative Schuring -- I got -- I have a package and that we're going to be talking a little about that. The other is the community reinvestment efforts. You have already made some efforts in this regard and I have a copy of some of that information. Notwithstanding that effort I think it should be examined for possible expansion and I think that's something you might want to look at in the very near future. Enterprise zones are also available and other places are taking advantage of enterprise zones to get tax, I guess help and so on and offer packages that are really important. And even port authorities quite frankly are - people establish port authorities for those same purposes. I noticed not too long ago in looking over some money that was available from the State of Ohio that there was even some large grants available for and giving people breaks if they had storage facilities - I mean warehouse facilities and so on in certain areas. And we need to check that because if you have any open space and somebody does build a building or would do something it might be a real incentive. So hopefully we can put that package together. I have quite a bit of information, but I need to gather more, then I need to analyze it.

Ms. Johnson: Another touchy one, but also very good for the City, is annexation. In view, I'm sure most of you are aware there is a new state law that will be taking effect October 26th, which will make this a little more difficult to do and we're very aware of that. But in light of that also, we're real excited, the Mayor's establishing a new working committee that citizen based to help us to continue to explore annexation and we'll be able to meet with them in the very near future and see what we can do. Again, there's where our land audits and some other things can all tie together to try to continue to expand our horizons here in the City.

Mr. Johnson: Inaudible...talk about...

Ms. Johnson: Inaudible...

Mr. Johnson: Okay, the other thing -- the last item that we have on the agenda and Teri can talk about that since she's been active in several communities that have already done this, is a survey - a business survey.

Ms. Johnson: We -- as I mentioned we did meet with the Economic Development Committee - Resource Committee out of the Chamber. And going to be working closely with them as well as you all and all the others that see fit to be a part of that. In doing a survey trying to see what current businesses feel is good, bad and indifferent. And also then about being able to expand otherwise. I think one thing being said probably over the last ten years, I'm sure Jim will back me up on this, working in a city similar to this over western area that were real good at annexation and some of those issues and also were very cognizant about making that city -- the businesses there happy to be there, proud to stay, wanting to expand as well as growth with new ones. So we -- I think again this city has a wonderful reputation. I have to say that when I told someone over there what I was looking at becoming a part of the first thing they said is why, they don't need anything, everything's perfect over there.

Mr. Johnson: Everything's perfect.

Ms. Johnson: And the neat thing about it was knowing that clear back from growing up in this city and being a part of that and the image that we all had, still 25 years later is the same. So I was tickled and thrilled. But what a great place to start to know that there's probably a lot more that we can really do and how surprised everybody will be in the future.

Mr. Johnson: In closing we just want to tell you that the first law of success is learning to get excited about what you're doing. And we're very excited about the opportunity to try to do something. And we're not sure how much we can get accomplished. But I can tell you one thing, we have two speeds, wide open and sleep. And we're going to go down the road at this. The second law of leader success is exposure to experience. You all have experience and knowledge and expertise and we need it. We need help from everyone. And hopefully we can do some good things and make some -- have some real accomplishments. Mr. Mayor, thanks.

Mayor Rice: Thank you Dave. Anybody have any questions for Dave or Teri? I think everybody can see and I mean it's unbelievable what has been accomplished just in the last two weeks. I mean they just started the first of this month and the number of meetings we've had and committees have been formed and positive things that are happening already are very exciting and think it's obvious to everyone here. You know, I think we're very fortunate to have them on our side working in these areas. I think we'll be able to accomplish a lot.

Mr. Snyder: Okay. Thank Dave, Teri...

Ms. Johnson: Thank you.

Mr. Snyder: appreciate it.

Mr. Johnson: Thank you...inaudible...

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Mayor Rice: Thank you.

Ms. Johnson: Thank you.

Mr. Snyder: Anybody else wish to speak before the Council?

Eileen Conrad: May I speak?

Mr. Snyder: Please. Step forward, state your name and address for the record.

Ms. Conrad: My name is Eileen Conrad. My address is 223 Orchard Hill SW - North Canton, Ohio 44720. May I speak?

Mr. Snyder: Please.

Ms. Conrad: Just wanted you to know this is the first time in 52 years that I've called the Police Department to ask for help by a detective. I had -- well, I'll just read it and then I won't goof up. I plan to attend an auction in North Canton tomorrow. I want to take my harpoon with me in case the thief is there. He is in jail and is now out on bond after taking two antiques from my garage. One item was value \$850.00; one item value \$40.00, which we have - I have located. I have been playing detective. My friend and I also were doing the detective work. Okay number two, I have a complaint that someone - that sometimes detectives are not here at the time they are expected. I said to him are you usually late? I was taught to always be on time. I feel my time was just as valuable as his. Number three, I was the one - I was the one who played detective in my case and would like to be reimbursed for my gas and oil and wear and tear on my tires. I was told I need receipts and I didn't save so now I am out also my time. And last, number four, I would like to attend a class that tells what I can expect from the Police Department. Thank you.

Mr. Snyder: Yes mam, thank you. Any questions?

Mrs. Magel: Yes, I have a question. Were you there whenever - at the time of the robbery?

Ms. Conrad: Well, I'm not real sure because he was a sneaky pete.

Mrs. Magel: Okay.

Ms. Conrad: He was a professional thief. My friend was unloading our car, which was out in the street. And he was unloading three heavy things that he brought in his truck. And somehow I think he may of taken it while my friends - I was in the house writing a check for the table I bought from the thief. And I think somehow, maybe, he could of taken it when her back was turned walking out to the car.

Mrs. Magel: Okay.

Ms. Conrad: Then if that was not the case, then he -- we all three left at the same -- we all three left at the same time. Because I never was in my car at all that day and I was riding with my friend. So my friend said we never - she never saw the red truck on Everhard. So we think he may have circled around and came back and just pretended like he owned the place.

Mrs. Magel: Okay, thank you.

Mr. Snyder: Okay. Anyone else in the audience wishing to speak before the Council?

Ms. Conrad: Oh, did I ask if - could I take the harpoon to the auction?

Mr. Snyder: Mam, I don't -- I can't answer that, that'd be up...

Ms. Conrad: Well the policeman would not let me through tonight to bring it up here.

Mr. Snyder: I don't - I have no idea. I'm not an attorney I don't know the ordinances...

Ms. Conrad: Well do we have an attorney on the end?

Mr. Snyder: Well I don't for that type -- Chief Grimes is there an ordinance carrying a lethal weapon into an auction?

Ms. Conrad: Well...

Chief Grimes: You're not allowed to bring it into City Hall, any weapons into City Hall. The auction at their place, that's up to them what they allow.

Ms. Conrad: Well he may be at the auction tomorrow and...

Mr. Snyder: You might want to check with the person who's responsible for the auction. That'd probably be your...

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Ms. Conrad: Well, and then that's another thing. I asked Kiko, I said you know, I really don't appreciate the fact that a thief is in the audience. Now I -- is there a way that we can prevent anybody like that?

Mr. Snyder: Mam I...

Mr. Boyajian: Mr. President, who's the thief?

Mr. Snyder: I don't...

Ms. Conrad: Pardon...

Mr. Boyajian: This should be a police matter. Should be handled by the police.

Ms. Conrad: Well I've...

Mr. Boyajian: There's nothing the Council can do for you.

Ms. Conrad: I have been on the phone every 10 minutes. I should of said to the Chief - I should of said no, it's like every 9 minutes. I mean I'm a common ordinary citizen - I do not expect more or less. And he's telling me to not call the Police Department anymore and I said alright sir.

Mr. Boyajian: You want to handle it?

Mr. Snyder: Thank you mam. Yes sir.

Don Scanlon: I'm Don Scanlon. I live 1545 Cambridge Avenue SW. And I address my remarks to Mr. Snyder. We spoke the last part of August regarding a traffic light.

Mr. Snyder: Yes sir, we did.

Mr. Scanlon: I was told prior to that, that, that light was promised for mid July. And when I talked with you at the end of August you seemed to be quite surprised that it wasn't up and wanted to have it in before school started. And I thought that was pretty good. And I didn't hear anything until late September. Three weeks ago when you called me you told me that all the engineering is done and some parts are on back order and was expected to be in by the 15th, which is today and I accepted that. I also asked you about a street sign. Now Cambridge Avenue, for those of you who are not familiar with it, is buried on the south end of Salway. And for visitors that are coming to town, coming in off the expressway, it's hard to find Salway; there's no street sign. And I believe that you did tell me three weeks ago that you would have the street sign put up.

Mr. Snyder: I did sir. I believe I talked to the Administrator...

Mr. Boyajian: He talked to me but...

Mr. Scanlon: I'm still looking for it.

Mr. Snyder: I did - I did speak to the Administrator about it on two occasions and he - he's well aware of it, but I...

Mr. Boyajian: He has talked to me in the last three weeks and we'll have a sign up by the end of the week or so.

Mr. Scanlon: Alright. Now I do want to thank you for having the other signs moved. There's only two of them there tonight and they only block the west view just a little bit. But the sooner we get that traffic light; we may save a serious accident.

Mr. Snyder: I believe Mr. Scanlon the problem -- am I not Jim -- there's -- the equipment is still on back... the standards...

Mr. Benekos: The poles.

Mr. Snyder: are still on back order. Everything is ready for the light and it's being pushed back by the manufacturer. It's totally out of our control. But we hope to -- now what's the date now from here?

Mr. Benekos: Whenever they deliver them. I mean they give you a date -- we have no control over it.

Mr. Scanlon: Well it seems strange with the economy down and people wanting things - a couple of poles? I guess I'll have to wait.

Mr. Snyder: As soon as they come Mr. Scanlon you're assured that they'll be erected.

Mr. Scanlon: Thank you, Mr. Snyder.

Mr. Snyder: Anytime. Appreciate it. Anybody else wishing to speak?

Jody Farnsworth. My name is Jody Farnsworth. 1342 Farrell Street SE. I was unable to be at the meeting on the 24th, but I see in the minutes that -- I don't have who brought it up, but somebody brought up the issue of Mrs. Mohler and the cats again, saying that Mrs. Mohler had not had any help at all. And someone was hoping that we were energized to get on this problem. Well after the meeting on the 10th, Mrs. Mohler contacted a rescue group and that person did tell her if trap a cat call us, we will come and take the cat. Since that time three other people, including myself, have gone and offered services to Mrs. Mohler. We said we would go and talk with the people who were taking care of these animals and we would educate them, we would help trap and we would take the animals away. In exchange we asked for her not to deal with the trapper, being as we never found out what happened to the animals. She said she couldn't do it. She just -- she would take our help, but she would not put off calling the trapper. We also found out that people in the neighborhood and somebody is here tonight to show you, have over

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\$4,000.00 worth of bills for the spaying, neutering and vaccinating those cats; there is proof. People also offered to go over to Mrs. Mohler's gardens, which are mulch, on a weekly basis and clean them out from any messes left by the cats. Again that was laughed at and the offer was dismissed. When I went over to Mrs. Mohler on the 18th, Saturday, whatever that was, when we talked to her, she was given people's cards - rescue group's cards and papers in bright pink paper. Did she call them last Friday? Well first of all the rescue group went in and took a cat out Monday. The cat is now spayed, was spayed within hours of being caught and now has a home. Mrs. Mohler on Friday, or Thursday of this past week, found it necessary to call the trapper. She called the trapper, had the trapper come out and place a trap and it caught a kitten. We have pictures of what is being done, what type of cages they're - he's putting out; rusty with feces and messes all over them. And this kitten sat in Mrs. Mohler's backyard in the trap from 11:00 in the morning until 6:30 at night. She seems to have misplaced or done something with the rescuer's number. Again, complaining that no one is willing to help. So my initial reason for coming and talking tonight was to give some sort of peace to whoever is so concerned that Mrs. Mohler is not receiving help. She is not wanting help. She wanting money, but she is not wanting true help. Inaudible...she -- we also told you that we know of these cats were people's cats, there was no remorse. She didn't care. Well I guess she's entitled to that. But I'm even more concerned after coming tonight and see that once again on tonight's meeting, the 15th, is Mrs. Mohler's nuisance complaint. And I guess I'm confused; I thought that was settled. I don't know if that can be addressed, but I want to let you know that if any of you are going to take the time to talk to Mrs. Mohler, you need to talk to other people, because you are not getting the whole story. There are issues here that I don't think anyone here would really want to defend. Thank you.

Mr. Snyder: Thank you.

Kim Caunah: My name is Kim Caunah. I live at 131 55th Street, North Canton 44720. Continuing on with Mrs. Mohler. I understand that this is on the docket again for another vote. I'd like to know from the Council what further information you were able to obtain that you feel that this needs to be brought up again? Could somebody answer me that?

Mrs. Magel: I guess I will. This is on my committee. It's for the 7:00 meeting, not the 6:00 meeting. Actually to answer your question there's been no more information.

Ms. Caunah: That's what I thought. Okay, what I've done in checking on the facts, which I'm sure if you'd of appointed somebody you could of done it too, I did a walkabout. Mrs. Mohler's information is incorrect. She lives in an older neighborhood, there's no young kids. There's middle school down the way. Also, the sandbox issues about the messing in the sandboxes, there's no sandboxes. There is one that's been converted into a big planter. Just thought you'd like to know. And I'm the one who that has right now, this is only a partial of it, I tallied it up, I have over \$4,000.00 in rescuer's bills that they paid in working in that area out of their own pocket to help take control of the population of the unwanted animals. So if the Council is so willing to pay taxpayers' money to reimburse Mrs. Mohler, I think you should reimburse us first. The only other thing I want to say is I'm very thankful that we're entering another election time, because you've demonstrated to all of us with this issues and others, what poor governing body you are. Even with the laws in front of you and I'm talking about the Ohio revised law regarding animals that states it is unlawful to trap domestics. You choose to ignore the law and are willing to abet taxpayers' money to pay for this, which thus is condoning the action. You took an oath to uphold the laws of this city and state and I'm just really kind of upset what this is coming down to. Your governing power appears to be very wishy, washy.

Mr. Snyder: Madam, I don't believe there's been any money expended at this time. There's been no money sent...

Ms. Caunah: It's just the idea that you brought it up again...

Mrs. Kiesling: Well I have a question.

Ms. Caunah: that it's coming back on.

Mrs. Kiesling: for - between the seven of us...

Mr. Snyder: I believe the Chairman brought it to the committee.

Mrs. Kiesling: Yea we don't know who brought it - put it on...

Mr. Snyder: I asked it be removed from the agenda. The Chairman insisted it placed on -- you might ask her why she had it placed back...

Mrs. Kiesling: had nothing to do with the rest of us.

Mr. Snyder: But if there's nothing else I'm going to have to bring your remarks to a close as we are in a time constraint.

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Mrs. Magel: Wait a minute, it was put on the agenda.

Mr. Snyder: And it was removed -- and it was also removed by the president and you asked it be placed on the agenda.

Mrs. Magel: And it has nothing to do with money. There will be a reason why I had to put that on the agenda. It had to do with safety.

Mr. Snyder: Well, I don't know.

Mrs. Magel: I had spoken -- yes, you do know.

Mr. Snyder: Well, I'm saying if there's anything...

Ms. Caunah: Safety issues regarding the animals or the kids?

Mrs. Magel: No, the children - the kids.

Ms. Caunah: There - first of all if anybody has done any background check, just a little bit of background check on things, ferrets don't want to be around humans, strays don't want to be around humans - they book. Well if you put something in a cage, yea it's going to look wild because it's trying to get out. If you walked into something and somebody put you in a cage, you'd fight heck to get out too. Well I'll close my - I have no other comments except I'm going to be the first one that's really going to work hard to make sure that many of you are not going to be in a governing position with us again.

Mr. Snyder: Thank you.

Peg Monteleone: Hi, Peg Monteleone. 1307 Lipton SW, North Canton - District 4. In regards to the safety issue, I called Canton Health Department and also Stark County Health Department and in as far as rabies goes, there has not been a case of terrestrial, that means walking on the ground such as cats, raccoons, since 1999 - there was one raccoon in Trumbull County. Before that was 1997, there was one skunk and one dog in Tuscarawas County. They can't even go back far enough in Stark County to find a case of rabies on terrestrial animals. The only time you're going to find a case of rabies right now, they had two positives on bats in Alliance. There's a four percent ratio of rabies in bats, so maybe we should be trapping the bats, not the cats. And as far as the health issue goes - I mean as far as the -- I'm not sure how you get money on the agenda, but the kitten that was trapped by the trapper, who I'm sure wasn't paid for it because we came and picked it up - I personally did. It was then spayed, all of its shots, I have the records here and bill for \$158.00 to take care of this animal, this nuisance animal, which is not a nuisance anymore to Mrs. Mohler. I don't whether we should go to her to collect or whether we should come to City Council now and ask for a reimbursement for disposing of this nuisance animal. And so that's about it - just the health issue concerns. And if you want I have the phone numbers of , you know, - I'm sure you do too - but of all the people that I talked to at the health departments. And so if you need to follow up on any of that data.

But if time limits are going to be imposed, I think they should be for everyone and not applied randomly when someone is speaking that you do not want to hear. I think that's very unfair. Thank you.


Mr. Snyder: Thank you. Any other comments? If not, I'll entertain a motion to adjourn.


